ELIGIBILITY: Toledo Artists' Club members and area artists.

ALL MEDIUMS: paintings, drawings, graphics, pastels, photos, three-D, ceramics, glass.

Entries should be images or objects that represent any aspect of autumn, including but not limited to, landscapes, people, or activities with an autumn theme.

ENTRY FEE: **TAC members:** \$10 per entry, or 3 for \$25.00 (**Voucher for 2**nd **entry:** \$10 discount)

No Refunds Non-members: \$15 per entry or 3 for \$40.00

ENTRIES: **Three (3)** works may be entered per individual. Attach official entry form (bottom of this prospectus) to upper left-hand corner on the back of framed work or the bottom of 3-D works.

ALL WORK MUST BE SUITABLY FRAMED UNDER ACRYLIC with wire, ready to hang (no sawtooth bars). Exceptions: pastels may be framed under glass; glazing is not required for canvas. Framing for canvas is required unless the sides of the canvas are part of the painting. Submissions must be original (no giclees, not copied, not done in a class or workshop). *Maximum framed size*: 36" x 48". *TAC reserves the right to refuse any subject deemed unsuitable*.

PICK-UP: Work not accepted can be picked up when the club is open. Accepted works can be picked up when the

club is open after the show closes. EXHIBITED WORK MUST REMAIN HANGING FOR THE DURATION OF

THE SHOW UNLESS IT IS SOLD.

SALES: ALL WORK MUST BE FOR SALE and MUST HAVE A PRICE LISTED.

All sales will be handled by the TAC, which retains a 30% commission.
