The most distinguished African-American artist of the nineteenth century, **HENRY OSSAWA TANNER** was also the first African-American artist to achieve international acclaim. Tanner was born on June 21, 1859, in Pittsburgh, to Benjamin Tucker and Sarah Miller Tanner. Tanner's father was a college-educated teacher and minister; Sarah Tanner was a former slave whose mother had sent her north via the Underground Railroad. Tanner's family settled in Philadelphia where his artistic interests were developed. Throughout his teens, Tanner painted and drew constantly in his spare time. When Tanner was twenty-one, he enrolled in the prestigious Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts, where he studied with Thomas Eakins. 1888 he moved to Atlanta, Georgia, where he met Bishop and Mrs. Joseph Crane Hartzell, who became his primary white patrons. The Harzells provided an endowment that allowed Tanner to move to Paris, where he studied at the Académie Julian, painting African-American and religious subjects. His paintings won medals at the Paris Salon, and one was purchased by the French government and now hangs in the Louvre. Spurred by his newly found acclaim, Tanner visited Philadelphia for several months in 1893. The visit, however, convinced him that he could not fight racial prejudice. Tanner returned to Paris and focused on painting religious subjects and landscapes. His 1895 painting, *Daniel in the Lion's Den*, was awarded a silver medal at the Universal Exposition in Paris; the following year it received a silver medal at the Pan American exhibition in Buffalo. In 1910 Tanner was elected a member of the National Academy of Design. In 1923 he was made an honorary chevalier of the Order of the Legion of Honor, France's highest honor, and in 1927 he became a full academician of the National Academy of Design, the first African American to receive that honor. On May 25, 1937, Tanner died at his home in Paris.

ELIGIBILITY: Toledo Artists' Club members and area artists.

All mediums: paintings, drawings, graphics, pastels, photos, sculpture, three-D, ceramics, glass.

Theme Description: Anything related to our beautiful region, Cityscapes to Metroparks, and Rural vistas.

Tape a label on the upper back left corner of each entry. PLEASE do not staple or glue the tag to your piece.

ENTRY FEE: **TAC members:** \$10 per entry, or 3 for \$25.00
No Refunds **Non-members:** \$15 per entry or 3 for \$40.00

ENTRIES: **Three (3)** works may be entered per individual. Attach official entry form (bottom of this prospectus) to the front or side of the piece with the blank side facing out or to the bottom of 3-D works so that the artist's name is not visible. Tape should be Painter's blue tape or equal.
TAC IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY DAMAGE TO ART WORK.

ALL WORK MUST BE SUITABLY FRAMED UNDER ACRYLIC with wire, ready to hang (no sawtooth bars).
Exceptions: pastels may be framed under glass; glazing is not required for canvas. Framing for canvas is required unless the sides of the canvas are part of the painting. Submissions must be original (no giclees, not copied, not done in a class or workshop). *Maximum framed size: 36" x 48". TAC reserves the right to refuse any subject deemed unsuitable.*

PICK-UP: Work not accepted can be picked up when the club is open. **EXHIBITED WORK MUST REMAIN HANGING FOR THE DURATION OF THE SHOW UNLESS IT IS SOLD.** Exhibited works must be picked up within 30 days of the show's end.

SALES: **ALL WORK MUST BE FOR SALE and MUST HAVE A PRICE LISTED.**
All sales will be handled by the TAC, which retains a 25% commission.
